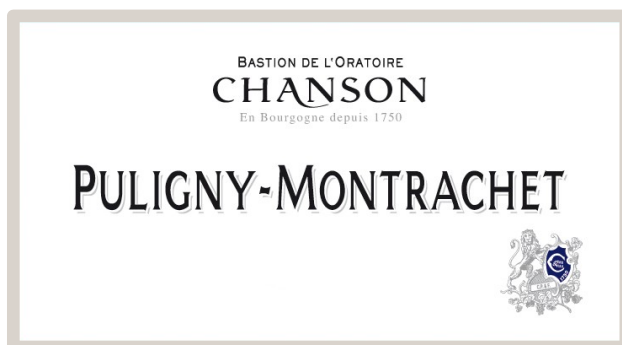

2013 VINTAGE

"The grapes are sourced from a vineyard of 3 plots in the lieu-Dit "Les Nosroyes" which is located across the Perrières. Bright gold colour with shiny tinges. The nose is mineral and slightly floral and displays aromas of honey, citrus fruit and white pear. Very complex. On the palate the wine is crunchy, fresh, sappy at first and then it displays all its complexity. It is round with some edges and is constantly changing. The finish is taut and changing with a combination of citrus fruit, wood and exotic fruit displaying a beautiful minerality."

“ From arguably the finest village for chardonnay, this pale golden wine has understated fruit power – pineapple, peach and apple are well matched by savoury oatmeal and toasty barrel influences. Still bright and fresh, it shows flinty complexity, and finishes long firm acidity.” Wish – Mar. 2017

"Ripe and lush, this resounds with peach and apricot flavors, backed by butter and toasty oak. Well-integrated, with a lively structure and a long, satisfying finish.

The palate is lemony, ripely citrus with some minerality, quite youthfully sherbet at the moment. Quiver of mineral on the finish. Nicely balanced and pure.

Not especially profound, but elegant and at the moment a notch up on the village Meursault. Good+ From 2012 Jean-Pierre and Gilles speak of the difficulty they have every year in sourcing the fruit from the three top villages. Puligny is toughest, after this Chassagne, then Meursault. They would like to secure more from Puligny. The Nosroyes grower is an established and good source. They have a new grower and would like to have more from him." «Voluminous, fresh and powerful. Beautiful aftertaste of bitter almond.»

«Discreet if not invisible wood does not unduly dampen the expressiveness of the pretty mix of ripe orchard fruit and floral aromas that are in keeping with the notably ripe and seductively textured medium-bodied flavors that possess good fat and volume before culminating in a sappy, mouth coating and lingering finish. I like the generosity but there isn't enough complexity to raise this to the next level.»

2006 VINTAGE

« Puligny's steel shows well in the ripe, full wine that cannot hide the minerality of the appellation. Brought together, the white fruits and the core of tightness are surrounded by intense new wood flavors and vivid fresh acidity. 2005 VINTAGE

« A solid benchmark for Puligny, this has fresh yellow apple and tart pear flavor set into the tension of chardonnay grown in limestone. Oak deepens the aroma but doesn't get in the way of the purity of the fruit. Simple and pretty, this should age with grace. » Wine & Spirits – Oct. 2008
